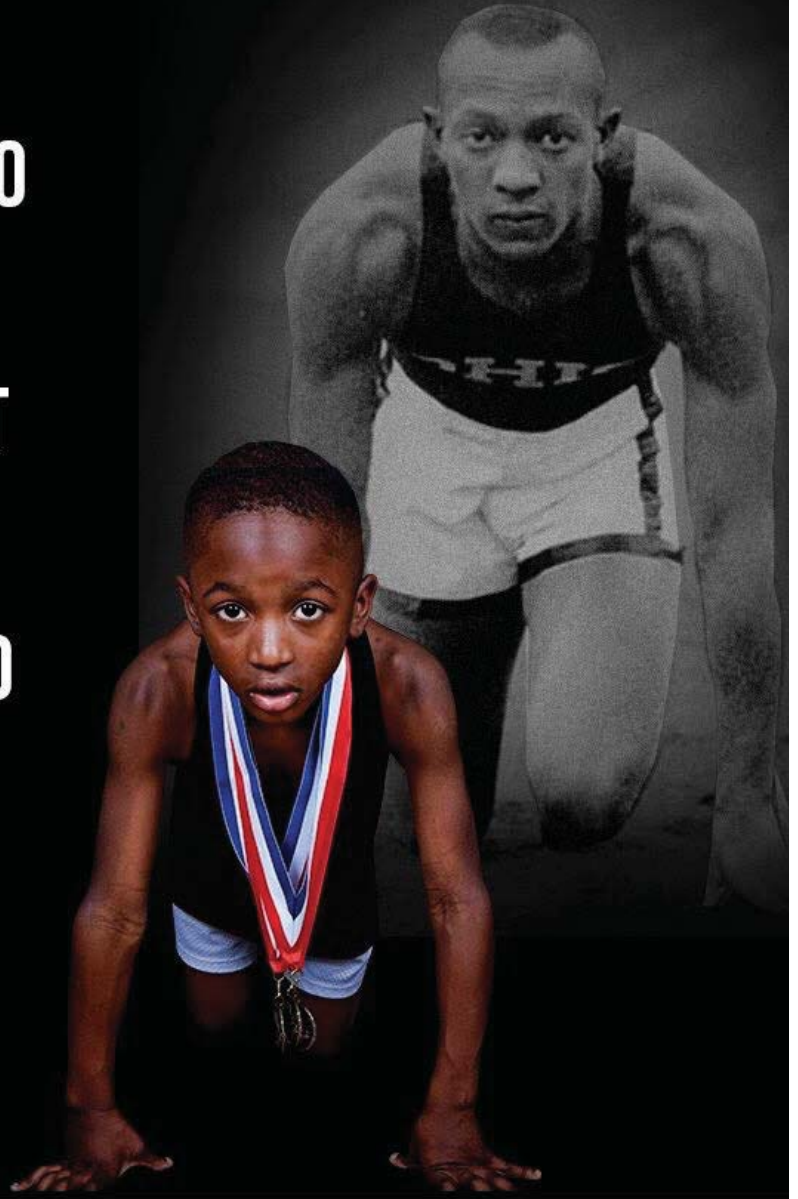

- Choose a password that is easy to remember but hard for others to figure out (e.g., favorite candy? \$kittles; Pet’s name? R0v3r; Fun TV show? \$pongeB0B; etc.)

- Students should substitute characters for letters in order to make their passwords more secure such as: a=@, o=0, L=1, S=\$ or 5, b=6, E=3
- Never share their District network password
- Tell a trusted adult if they think someone else has their password
- Never use someone else's account for any reason

FSA Testing

All 9th and 10th grade students will take the writing portion of the ELA FSA during the week of Feb 27th - March 3rd.

All Juniors will be taking the SAT test Wednesday, March 1st.

Parents, as we enter the testing season these are some things to keep in mind:

-- During PSAT, FSA, EOC, and Midterm/Final Exams students are not permitted to leave campus while the test is in progress. Once the testing period has begun students must stay in their class until the end of the period. Please plan appointments accordingly. Thank you for your cooperation.

-- Students may not have cell phones, smart watches or any other electronic devices near them during testing. These items will be collected and kept in a safe place until testing is complete.

-- All students need to have a photo ID with them at all times so the Testing Administrators can verify their identity.

-- Please bring headphones/earbuds for testing.

-- Please make sure students are well fed and rested on testing days.

-- State of the art software programs examine all testing results and can statistically pinpoint students who may have shared answers. If this occurs, student tests may be invalidated.

-- Encourage your child to relax, do his or her best, and rely on the testing tips and preparation which has been ongoing within our classrooms.

FSA (Florida State Assessment) Practice Tests

<http://fsassessments.org/students-and-families/practice-tests/>. These Practice Tests are intended to familiarize students with the types of items that will make up the tests and with the tools that will be available to them.

Students should have all of their admission materials submitted to the FIU Admissions Office prior to the scholarship deadline. Award offers cannot be made unless a student has been fully admitted to FIU prior to our review of scholarship applications. Please note that while students may apply for both awards, they can only be the recipient of one scholarship. The following is a summary of the minimum criteria/requirements needed to be considered for each scholarship for award year. The scholarship is open to all high school seniors who meet the minimum criteria. The applicant must be a U.S. citizen or resident alien with a weighted high school GPA of 3.5 or better. The student must submit the following documents with their completed application form by the deadline: A resume highlighting high school involvement/leadership, community service experience and awards/honors. employer on official letterhead.

A copy of their FIU acceptance letter.

An unofficial transcript with their weighted G.P.A.

A copy of their SAT and/or ACT scores.

A two-page essay outlining their personal mission statement and how the MPAS or Golden Drum scholarship will help you in achieving your mission. (Typed, double-spaced, 10 or 12 pt. font with a 1-inch margin)

To participate in the Golden Drum Scholarship selection process, the student must submit the completed application form, signed and dated by the student and parent along with all of documents listed above by the deadline. Any application packet missing documents and/or received after the deadline will not be considered.

The MPAS Scholars Award is a tuition-based scholarship available to incoming freshman at Florida International University. This award places a major emphasis on identifying and developing emerging leaders. It pays \$1,000 toward tuition per semester and is renewable each year (fall and spring terms only) for a total of four years with an academic performance of a 2.75 GPA or above and enrollment in a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester.

Students should have all of their admission materials submitted to the FIU Admissions Office prior to the scholarship deadline. Award offers cannot be made unless a student has been fully admitted to FIU prior to our review of scholarship applications. Please note that while students may apply for both awards, they can only be the recipient of one scholarship. A two-page essay outlining their personal mission statement and how the MPAS or Golden Drum scholarship will help you in achieving your mission. (Typed, double-spaced, 10 or 12 pt. font with a 1-inch margin)

To participate in the MPAS Scholarship selection process, the student must submit the completed application form, signed and dated by the student and parent with all of documents listed above by the deadline. Any application packet missing documents and/or received after the deadline will not be considered.

For the 2017 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2014, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2014, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2017.

Great-grandchildren are not eligible.

The applicant must be a high school senior.

The applicant must apply online only. The 2017 Legacy Awards application deadline is 11:59 a.m. Central Time on Friday, February 3, 2017.

If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.

Applications received from those who do not meet the eligibility criteria above will not be considered.
